**Italians/We can't stay in Canada without a visa longer than six months.**

3) Which nationals don't have to get a visa if they are in Canada on transit to the USA?

**The nationals of China, Indonesia, Thailand, Taiwan and Philippines don't have to apply for a visa if they are on transit to the USA.**

- 4) Why do you have to decide which type of visa you need before application?  
**You have to decide which type of visa you need before application because visa application procedures vary according to the type of visa.**
- 5) What are the basic requirements for entry to Canada?  
**All visitors must have a valid individual travel document, such as a passport; be in good health; convince an immigration officer that in their country of origin they have ties, such as a job, home, financial assets and a family, that will take them back; convince an immigration officer that you will leave Canada at the end of your visit and have enough money for your stay.**
- 6) Who checks aspiring visitors upon entry to Canada?  
**Immigration officers check aspiring visitors upon entry to Canada.**
- 7) Which changes can be made to a Canada visitor status?  
**You can extend your visit or stay; change the type of permit you hold (for example, from a student to a work permit); change a condition of your permit (for example, if you are studying and you want to change schools, or if you are working and you want to change your job).**
- 8) When do you have to apply to change a Canada visitor status?  
**You mustn't apply later than 30 days before your status expires.**
